ELECTION DAY GUIDELINES

- The services provided by election workers are essential to the election process. Election workers are helpful and courteous at all times.
- An Email address must be furnished to the Supervisor of Elections Office for future correspondence.
- The Clerk is in charge of the polling place. **This position requires minimal computer experience**. The election worker coordinator will contact you regarding assignments at the polls.
- New applicants may be assigned as alternate election workers. Alternates could be called upon to work <u>at any time</u> prior to Election Day and sometimes on election morning. Therefore, it is important that **every alternate be prepared for a last minute call!**
- Election workers are paid only if they work an election. Prior to <u>EVERY</u> election, election workers and alternates must attend training as required by Florida Law. (F.S. 102.014). Election workers are expected to pass minimum competency requirements to work.
- On Election Day you must report to your assigned polling place no later than 5:45 a.m. Parking spaces adjacent to polling place(s) should be left for voters. The polls close at 7:00 p.m. and everyone is required to work the <u>full</u> day. No one is released until all election board tasks are completed, and the Clerk authorizes the dismissal.
- Proper attire (business casual) is required. Election workers shall not wear any jewelry, buttons, pins, etc., that suggest political party affiliation or promote a candidate or any issue on the ballot.
- Election workers shall not make any partisan statements or remarks while working at the polls or engage in conversation involving the personal business of the voter to other election workers.
- Everyone should come prepared to spend a **full** day, **bringing lunch**, **supper and any other necessities** such as **medicine**, etc. No one may leave the polling place during the day. If you must leave for any reason you can *NOT* return.
- Smoking is not permitted by election workers within or near the entrance to the polling place.
- Election workers *must* follow Florida Laws and Supervisor of Elections instructions exactly. The election must be conducted as trained by the Supervisor of Election's office. Please *DO NOT* allow changes to be made based on the suggestion of others, outside the Supervisor of Election's office.
