

BECOMING A CANDIDATE IN SUMTER COUNTY



WHAT IS A CANDIDATE?

A candidate is defined in 97.021(6) & 106.011(3), Florida Statutes, as any person who:

- Seeks to qualify for nomination or election by means of a petitioning process;
- Seeks to qualify for election as a write-in candidate;
- Receives contributions or makes expenditures or gives his or her consent for any other person to receive contributions or make expenditures with a view to bringing about his or her nomination or election to, or retention in, public office;
- > Appoints a treasurer and designates a primary depository; or
- > Files qualification papers and subscribes to a candidate's oath as required by law.

WHO CAN BE A CANDIDATE?

- Must be registered voter in Florida;
- For those seeking a partisan office, may not have been a registered member of any other political party for 365 days before the beginning of qualifying preceding the general election for which the person seeks to qualify.
- ➤ If required, one's current position or office must be resigned under the "resign to run" law and in accordance with section 99.012(3), Florida Statutes.

DEFINITIONS

Filing Officer	The election official to whom a candidate submits his qualifying papers and campaign reports: for county-wide offices, the filing officer is the Sumter County Supervisor of Elections; for multi-county, state or federal offices, the filing officer is the Florida Department of State (F.S. 99.061). Municipal candidates for Bushnell, Center Hill, Coleman, Webster and Wildwood file with Supervisor of Elections.
In-Kind Contribution	A giving of goods, services or anything having attributable monetary value to a campaign, the value of which is determined by the person making the contribution (F.S. 106.011(5), 106.055).
Non-Partisan Office	An office for which a candidate is prohibited from campaigning or qualifying for an election or retention in office based on party affiliation (F.S. 97.021(22)).
Petition Process	A method of qualifying for office which requires obtaining a pre-determined number of voter signatures on petition cards (F.S. 99.095).
Political Advertisement	Please refer to F.S. 106.011(15).
Qualifying Period	The dates set by law during which the final paperwork and a qualifying fee (if required) is filed with the candidate's filing officer (F.S. 99.061).

- U.S. Senator, U.S. Representative, Judge, State Attorney, and Public Defender:
 - Noon, April 2, 2018
- County, Special Districts & Cities:
 - Noon, May 21, 2018

QUALIFYING DATES (by appointment ONLY)

- Judicial: Noon, April 30, 2018 to Noon, May 4, 2018
- County, Special Districts & Cities: Noon, June 18 Noon, June 22, 2018

MATERIAL SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE.

PRE-FILING FORMS

- Candidates can pre-file at any time before qualifying week.
- Nothing prohibits a person from announcing his or her intention to become a candidate prior to filing a Form DS-DE 9, as long as no contributions and expenditures have been made and a campaign bank account https://example.com/has-not-been-opened.

Form DS-DE 9, Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository

- Shall be filed with the filing officer prior to opening the campaign banking account.
- Is not effective until fully completed, signed and filed with the filing officer.
- Is not considered "filed" upon mailing.

Exception: Special district candidates who do not collect contributions and whose only expense is the signature verification fee or filing fee are not required to file the DS-DE-9 [99.061(3)].

DO NOT OPEN YOUR CAMPAIGN BANK ACCOUNT UNTIL YOU FILE THE DS-DE 9 FORM WITH OUR OFFICE!



Don't incur any expenses or collect \$ until proper documents are filed first!

QUALIFYING BY PETITION METHOD

Local candidates will need 922 valid signatures. Special district candidates will need 25 valid signatures.



- > Signatures may not be obtained until the candidate has filed the Appointment of Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository, DS-DE 9, with the filing officer.
- A signature verification fee of 10¢ (ten cents) per each petition to be verified must be paid in advance out of the candidate's campaign account or petty cash (except for certain special district candidates).
- > The candidate will receive a certification once petition requirements have been met.
- The petition certification is required during the official qualifying period.
- Write-in candidates are not required to collect petitions or pay a qualifying fee.

PETITION SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Candidates for local office must submit the required number of valid petitions to the Supervisor of Elections prior to their Petition Deadlines. (see Deadlines for Candidates on previous page

- It is recommended that you plan to collect more petitions than the requirement and submit them to the Elections Office in batches.
- We will verify the petitions as you collect them and provide a running total.
- > Do not wait until the last minute to submit petitions!
- No petitions are accepted after the due date.
- Candidates who fail to qualify by the petition method will be required to pay the qualifying fee.

QUALIFYING BY PAYING FEE

- Any candidate, who does not obtain a Petition Certification, must pay the qualifying fee to the Supervisor of Elections by the end of the qualifying period.
- > The total amount of the fee is based upon a percentage of the annual salary of the office sought.
- ➤ A filing fee of 3% and an election assessment fee of 1% must be paid by all candidates for county office who qualify by fee method.
- Partisan candidates pay an additional 2% party assessment fee.
- Special districts pay \$25.00.
- > Write-in candidates pay no fee and are not required to obtain the petition certification.
- A properly executed check drawn upon candidate's campaign account and signed by the campaign treasurer must be used to pay the qualifying fee.

QUALIFYING PERIOD

Candidates for judicial and county offices, special districts and cities (Bushnell, Center Hill, Coleman, Webster, and Wildwood) must file their qualifying paperwork and pay the qualifying fee (if required) at the Supervisor of Elections Office in Wildwood, Florida.

WHAT DO I NEED TO FILE DURING QUALIFYING?

Pursuant to Section 99.061(7), Florida Statutes,

- ALL items required for qualifying must be received in CORRECT and COMPLETE order by the end of the qualifying period, otherwise you will not be deemed a qualified candidate.
- The following items must be received by the Supervisor of Elections no later than 12:00 PM on the last day of the candidate's qualifying period. (see dates listed above)

EXPENDITURES

CAMPAIGN REPORTING

CONTRIBUTIONS

- Pay all by check drawn on campaign account
- · Including qualifying fee

- Cash contribution limit \$50 (cash or cashier's check)
- (Candidates with Opposition) Deadline to accept:
 5 days prior to election

FOR BOTH EXPENDITURES & CONTRIBUTIONS:

- Must have Full name, address, specific occupation/description of business, amount & date (clear description of business/occupation)
- If under \$100: type of business/occupation not required.

REPORTS

- Must be submitted by midnight on due date
- Amended reports must be submitted within 7 days of notification
- · Waiver report is submitted even if no activity.

FINES

Must be paid from personal account, NOT CAMPAIGN

Penalty for Late Filing: Any candidate <u>failing to file</u> a report on the designated due date shall be subject to a fine of <u>\$50 per day for the first 3 days late</u> and, thereafter, **\$500** per day for each late day, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report. However, for reports immediately preceding each primary and general election, the fine shall be <u>\$500 per day for each late day</u>, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

For <u>90 day termination reports</u>, the fine is <u>\$50 per day for each late day</u>, not to exceed 25% of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the late report.

TERMINATION REPORT

CANDIDATES WHO FILE FINANCIAL REPORTS WITH OUR OFFICE

Purchase "thank you" advertising up to <u>75 days after</u> candidate withdraws, becomes unopposed, is eliminated, or elected to office

Pay for items which were obligated before the candidate withdrew, became unopposed, was eliminated, or elected to office

Once a candidate

withdraws, become unopposed, is eliminated, or elected to office,
THE CANDIDATE MAY ONLY EXPEND FUNDS FROM THE CAMPAIGN ACCOUNT TO:

Pay for expenditures necessary to close down the campaign office and to prepare final campaign reports

Dispose of surplus funds as provided in Section 106.141, F.S.

A Candidate has **90 DAYS** to dispose of funds and **remit their Termination Report** to the filing officer. Failing to file a report on the designated due date shall be subject penalties (*listed in above slide*)
