

**FROM YOUR SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS:**

Let's talk about absentee voting or what is now being called vote by mail. It was just a short time ago by law you had to have a good reason, like being in the hospital, to receive a vote-by-mail ballot. But times have changed and now you can receive a vote-by-mail ballot just because that's how you choose to vote.

To request a vote-by-mail ballot you can call or stop by any one of my offices or go to our website at [www.sumterelections.org](http://www.sumterelections.org). It only takes a couple of minutes to give us the needed information.

Here are just a few things that you need to know about vote-by-mail ballots:

1. **Vote-by-mail ballots ARE NOT FORWARDABLE. You MUST be at the address you gave us to receive that ballot because it will NOT be forwarded to you. It will be returned back to my office and it will cancel any future requests you may have on file.**
2. **If you have not received your vote-by-mail ballot within 3 weeks before the election, please call the office to check on it. It may have gotten lost in the mail or have been returned to our office. Then we would still have time to send you another ballot.**
3. **In filling out your envelope, MAKE sure you SIGN the back of the envelope. No one else can sign for you. You cannot use a Power of Attorney or a Notary to sign for someone else. Husbands and wives be careful to sign your envelope not your spouses.**
4. **Please do not wait until the last minute to mail your ballot back to us. It may not reach us in time to be counted. If we are within just a few days of the election and you live in the county, please bring it into the office and drop it off. Also when mailing your ballot back to us, it may cost extra postage. This usually happens when we have a two page ballot. And you must put a stamp on the envelope when you mail it back to us, postage is NOT free.**
5. **Husbands and wives Do Not mail your ballots back in one envelope to save postage. Every voter has their own specific envelope with their own specific information on it for a reason. It is very important that you mail your ballot back in your envelope with your name on it and remember to sign the back of the envelope.**
6. **Postage: You must put postage on your ballot when you mail it back to us. They are not postage paid.**
7. **Please remember that once your vote-by-mail ballot is mailed to you I have no control over what happens to it once it leaves my office.**
8. **The Supervisor of Elections Office located in Wildwood and the Villages will close at 3:00 PM on Election Day as all staff is needed in the Bushnell Office. If you have a vote-by-mail ballot to drop off at Wildwood or The Villages please do so by 3:00 PM and they MUST be dropped off at the Bushnell Office by 7:00 PM Election night.**
9. **If you want someone to pick up your vote-by-mail ballot for you, they cannot do that for you until August 25th. For more information, please contact our office as there are more instructions.**
10. **If you have already requested a vote-by-mail ballot these ballots will be mailed between July 26th and August 2nd. Thereafter vote-by-mail ballots will be mailed daily until August 26th.**
11. **If you have requested a vote-by-mail ballot for the Primary Election and there is any question about where the ballot is to be mailed, please call our office to confirm the mailing address.**
